SUBJECT: **Upcoming Transit System Changes**

The purpose of this item is to update the committee on upcoming transit system changes including potential bus route modifications and changes to regional transit fare policy. In particular, Transportation staff is seeking assistance from the School District in communicating the proposed set of bus service modifications to students and parents along with the ways in which they can participate in the public involvement process.

Bus Route Modifications

Transportation staff is initiating a public involvement process for residents to comment on the operating and route performance of the Orbit system in general as well as on several potential fixed route bus route changes including routes Route 92: Guadalupe/48th Street; Route 30: University; Route 44: Tatum/44th Street; Route 40: Apache/University; Orbit Earth; Route 62: Hardy. Proposed fixed route bus changes are intended to reduce operating costs or be budget neutral while improving system efficiency, effectiveness, and ridership. Fixed route bus service changes, if approved, would become effective July 27, 2009.

Additional Orbit changes emerging from this process will also strive to reduce operating costs or be budget neutral, demonstrate responsiveness to resident concerns, and make operational and performance improvements. Since the inception of the Orbit neighborhood circulator system, Transportation staff have, and will continue to work closely with Tempe Elementary School District #3 (TD3) staff (Paul Novak, Linda Cook, Ernie Ontiveros & Monica Allread) to ensure the system serves adjacent schools safely and properly. Any additional Orbit changes, if identified and approved, would become effective in July or August 2009.

Regional Transit Fare Policy

Valley Metro and member agencies are considering transit and ADA dial-a-ride fare increases as part of an effort to mitigate declines in regional and local sales taxes and rising operating costs. The Valley Metro Board of Directors authorized a January 2009 valley-wide public involvement process during which Valley Metro staff presented information on five (5) bus/LRT fare increase scenarios along with a proposed increase to ADA dial-a-ride fares. Based on feedback received from the public and subsequent negotiations among valley cities, a consensus has been reached and approved by two of three governing committees at Valley Metro. Consideration by the Board of Directors will take place on March 19, 2009.

The recommendation is summarized below:

Cash Fares

- LOCAL single ride cash fare (bus and light rail) from \$1.25 to \$1.75
- EXPRESS single ride cash fare from \$1.75 to \$2.75
- REDUCED single ride cash fare (bus and light rail) from \$0.60 to \$0.85

Local Passes

- 1 day pass (purchased OFF BUS) from \$2.50 to \$3.50
- 1 day pass (purchased ON BUS) from \$2.50 to \$5.25
- 3 day pass from \$7.50 to \$10.50
- 7 day pass remains unchanged at \$17.50

- 31 day pass from \$45 to \$55

Express Passes

- 1 day pass (purchased OFF BUS) from \$3.50 to \$5.50
- 1 day pass (purchased ON BUS) from \$3.50 to \$7.25
- 31 day pass from \$68 to \$85

Reduced Passes

- 1 day pass (purchased OFF BUS) from \$1.25 to \$1.75
- 1 day pass (purchased ON BUS) from \$1.25 to \$2.60
- 3 day pass from \$3.75 to \$5.25
- 7 day pass remains unchanged at \$8.75
- 31 day pass from \$22.50 to \$27.50

ADA Dial-a-Ride Fare

- Increase from \$2.00 to \$2.50 in July 2009
- Increase by \$0.25 in each subsequent year through 2012 until fare is 2 times the LOCAL single ride cash fare (\$3.50)

Attachment A: Overview of Bus/Orbit Service Proposed Changes

Transportation staff based the development of the bus service proposals around the core mission of building local and regional transit ridership. The following principles guided the development of bus service changes in preparation for the introduction of light rail. They continue to provide a basis for evaluating present and future bus service changes:

- Reduce operating costs or remain budget neutral
- Improve efficiency
- Grid system alignment (maximize connections and system effectiveness)
- City-wide system coverage (ensure equitable distribution of service)
- Bus-rail coordination
- Improve regional connections
- Provide parallel and inter-station bus service to LRT

DESCRIPTION OF BUS SERVICE CHANGES

Route 30-University & Route 92-Guadalupe/48th Street:

Route 92 would be adjusted to provide service along 52nd St. between Broadway Rd. and Rio Salado Pkwy. and on Rio Salado Pkwy. between 52nd St. and Ash Ave. This is a dense employment corridor that houses numerous large employers, hotels, and city facilities and presently lacks sufficient bus service.

If this change were implemented, the route would no longer serve Broadway Rd. between 52nd St. and Mill Ave. and Mill Ave. between Broadway Rd. and 5th St. This change would require northbound 92 passengers wishing to go to areas of Broadway Rd. between 52nd Street and Mill Ave. (including Tempe High School) to make a transfer to the route 45. In addition, people living or working along Broadway Rd. between Mill Ave. and 52nd Street would experience a reduction in access to downtown Tempe and portions of south Tempe. However, this segment of the city is served by numerous bus routes that provide the same kind of travel options, including routes 66 – Mill, 65 – Kyrene/Mill, 45 – Boadway, 62 – Hardy, 56 – Priest, and Orbit Venus.

In addition to the benefits of the route 92 realignment, this change also makes possible a change to the route 30 (University Dr.) that would eliminate a present deviation south of University Dr. The benefit of this deviation is small in relation to the impact on through-riding passengers. This change would reduce travel time for route 30 passengers commuting beyond 52nd St. in either direction and reduce operating costs.

Route 44 – Tatum/44th Street:

Route 44 operates along Tatum and 44th Street in Phoenix. Soon after stopping at the Washington and 44th Street light rail station, route 44 enters Tempe providing service along University Dr. to downtown Tempe. Given the transfer to light rail and shorter trip times to downtown Tempe, Transportation staff recommend elimination of route 44 in Tempe. Because the route 44 is operated by the City of Phoenix, the cost to Tempe is nearly 40 percent higher than if the service were operated by either Tempe's or Valley Metro/RPTA's contractor. If approved, the route 44 southern terminus would be at the discretion of the City of Phoenix; however, this proposal is contingent upon maintaining the connection to light rail at Washington and 44th Street. The removal of route 44 service on University Dr. is offset by the presence of route 30-University, route 40-Apache/University (if maintained), route 62-Hardy, route 56 – Priest, route 92-Gaudalupe/48th Street (pending approval of realignment), and Orbit Venus.

Route 40 – Apache/University:

In December 2008 the route 40 was implemented to replace portions of the Red Line bus route that was discontinued with the introduction of light rail. Route 40 is funded by the Regional Public Transportation Authority from the eastern city boundary to downtown Tempe. In response to community input, it was determined that the City of Tempe would provide local funding to extend the route west to Sky Harbor International Airport. Transportation staff are examining ridership on route 40 to determine its productivity in light of the introduction of light rail and the Washington and 44th Street Sky Harbor shuttle transfer station. In addition, comments from residents on their use and need for the route 40 to continue operating along University Dr. to Sky Harbor will be useful in determining whether or not this route segment is truly needed or whether its western terminus should be downtown Tempe.

Orbit Earth:

Two realignments are proposed for Orbit Earth. The first proposal recommends shifting the western portion of the route from Sunset Dr. and Cavalier Rd. to College Avenue. This proposal is grounded in an effort to improve route efficiency, improve travel times, reduce proximity to frequent bus service on Scottsdale Rd, improve overall neighborhood access, and respond to resident concerns along Sunset/Cavalier. The second proposal recommends shifting the route from Weber Dr., Mary St., and Tempe Dr. to Miller Rd. This proposal is intended to improve efficiency and travel times, reduce operating costs, and maintain the neighborhood's accessibility to Orbit Earth within a reasonable walking distance.

Route 62:

The downtown turnaround loop (on College Ave., University Dr., and Mill Ave.) would be discontinued. This loop is no longer operationally necessary due to the opening of the Tempe Transportation Center. If implemented, Route 62 would travel straight east – west on 5th St. to the Transportation Center. This minor change will result in operating cost savings.

Orbit System:

Transportation staff is now evaluating early data on Orbit ridership in relation to the introduction of light rail. Although there are no proposed changes to the Orbit system at this time (except Orbit Earth), Transportation staff is inviting residents and stakeholders to voice concerns or suggestions they have regarding Orbit routing, policies (e.g., operating hours, frequency), operations, and/or future bus designs. Depending on the scope and feasibility of comments submitted and staff work on operational improvements to the system, a second phase to the public involvement process beyond the timeline noted in the cover memo may be necessary. In particular, Transportation staff will be critically evaluating the performance of the Mars route to determine whether the present route is sufficiently productive to warrant continuation or whether modifications are necessary.

Route 92 - 48th St/Guadalupe

Proposed Changes:

- Modify route to serve 52nd St. and Rio Salado Pkwy.
- Remove duplicate routing on Broadway Rd. and Mill Ave.
- Adds transit service to Tempe Center for the Arts, 52nd Street business corridor, and Tempe Beach Park.









Route 44 - 44th St/Tatum








Route 62 - Hardy

- Streamline route using 5th Street in both directions between Farmer/Ash and Tempe Transportation Center


Downtown Tempe Detail Map



Now that the Tempe Elementary School District Governing Board has approved the recommendations from the District Strategic Planning Team (DSPT), including the recommendation to repurpose Evans Elementary School, work is underway to determine the future use of the Evans facility.

Tempe Elementary invites and encourages anyone to submit a viable plan that meets the District-established criteria listed below:

- 1) Provides a net financial advantage to TD3
- 2) Fulfills a Tempe community need
- 3) Allows Tempe Elementary to maintain ownership
- 4) Produces a positive social outcome
- 5) Be a sustainable solution that can work for many years.

Anyone who would like to provide a plan for consideration is required to fill out an online form at www.tempeschools.org/evansrepurpose.

Plans will be accepted online through **March 15, 2009**. Viable plans that meet the established criteria will be forwarded to a team of community members and District administrators for review. Developers of the viable plans remaining will be invited to a 15-minute meeting with the community/District team on **March 17** to answer questions/provide further comments about their plan. The community/District team will determine those plans that best meet the established criteria and forward this list to the Governing Board for their consideration during the **March 18** study session/board meeting at the Sanchez Administration Center, 3205 South Rural Road in Tempe.
